Narrative Overview of Center/Institute Activities (*please include descriptions of collaborations*):

Between July 1, 2007 and June 30, 2008 faculty with the Institute for Engaged Aging partnered with other universities to establish two new Centers for Economic Excellence (CoEE); secured funding to endow the Osher Lifelong Learning Institute at Clemson University; obtained funding for six research studies submitted through the IEA; and submitted through the IEA four additional proposals to external funders, some of which are still in review. Additionally, faculty were very productive in publishing their work, mentoring students and serving the community.

The Institute for Engaged Aging and its partners at the University of South Carolina, Greenville Hospital System University Medical Center, and Palmetto Health were approved by the SC Commission for Higher Education for a new CoEE called SeniorSMART with three Endowed Chairs. The Endowed Chair in Senior Driving, Mobility and Physical Functioning will have an appointment with IEA and will work jointly with Greenville Hospital System. Approval of the CoEE brings \$5M in funding from the SC Lottery Control Board and \$5M from Health Sciences South Carolina.

Dr. Vince Gallicchio, in collaboration with the MUSC Hollings Cancer Center, received \$10 Million from the SC Lottery Control Board to establish another CoEE, "Cancer Stem Cells". Gallicchio will also serve as PI and Director for the "Education and Research Satellite Center in Trace Elements for UNESCO (United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization) at Clemson University" funded by UNESCO, Lyon, France, for approximately \$2 Million. UNESCO is a specialized agency of the United Nations, established in 1945.

Dr. Fran McGuire provided the leadership to successfully obtain funding to establish the Clemson University Osher Lifelong Learning Institute (OLLI). He was initially funded for a \$100,000 grant and then provided the leadership to secure a \$1,000,000 endowment from the Osher Foundation.

In February the first IEA Advisory Board meeting was held. Of the 14 leaders in the aging field who were invited to be members of the board, 13 agreed to serve and 12 attended the inaugural meeting. The board members, who represent a diversity of agencies and organizations that serve older adults (see table at end of report), were very enthusiastic about their role. At the meeting, they provided valuable advice about how to keep the IEA relevant to the needs of older South Carolinians and also requested that they meet twice a year in order to truly be a "working board". The IEA is fortunate to have such an esteemed and committed group of leaders as advisors and champions.

Another highlight for the IEA was hosting a successful conference, "South Carolina Aging Research conference: Movement and Mobility", from March 30 to April 1, 2008 for which 164 people registered. The conference, which featured over 20 nationally-recognized researchers from six states, received very positive evaluations by conference participants and was the first time that three separate state conferences combined for one event. The Director raised over \$24,000 in sponsor support for the conference. Additionally, in order to support and advance research of IEA faculty, a post-doctoral fellow position was created, approved and funded.

In the past fiscal year, the six funded research studies submitted through IEA reflect the multidisciplinary strength of the faculty. C. Dye and J. Eggert were funded through a subcontract with USC (2007-2010, \$149,000) by Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) for the new Palmetto State Geriatric Education Center. Health Sciences South Carolina (HSSC) funded two proposals submitted by IEA faculty through the South Carolina Aging Research Network (SCARN) - C. Dye, L. Cory and W. Logan received funding to conduct research to reduce secondary stroke (\$77,000) and V. Haley Zitlin will receive funding as a Co-I to conduct Vitamin D research with a USC professor. Dr. Nancy Porter received funding from the Administration on Aging (AoA) through the Lt Gov Office on Aging to conduct trainings in long-term care financial management. J. Brooks

and W. Logan at GHS were funded by the Fullerton Foundation for \$99,406 to conduct, “Feasibility and Implementation Grant: Helping Patients, Families, and Physicians decide if Older Adults can Live Independently”. C. Dye and D. Willoughby received second year funding (\$85,284) from HRSA for “Helping Rural Elders Transition from Home Health to Chronic Disease Self Management through Paraprofessional Outreach in their 3-year study.

Grant submissions through IEA for the reporting period include “Community Outreach Motivating Patients to Achieve Self-management Success (SC COMPASS)” (J. Williams and C. Dye) to HRSA through a subcontract with HealthSouth Carolinas (direct costs: \$253,200; indirect costs: \$25,320); a submission by J. Brooks and W. Logan to NIH through a subcontract with MUSC to fund, “Impact of Head & Neck Cancer Treatment on Driving Performance” for \$909,527 (direct costs) and \$396,728 (indirect costs) and a submission by Brooks and Logan with I. Walker (PI) to the National Science Foundation, for the study “ComforTABLE: an Intelligent Support Environment for Aging in Place” (\$499,999). Additionally, there was a submission by C. Dye and L. Cory to Health Sciences South Carolina for \$94,024 to fund the second year of their secondary stroke prevention study in collaboration with SCARN. Other externally-funded grants awarded to IEA faculty include \$958,322 from the Department of Defense to D. Battisto for “Patient Room of the Future Prototype”; \$60,000 from the American Federation for Aging Research to Y. Dong for the study, “Characterization of the Role of C.elegans Host Cell Factor (HCF-1) in Life Span Regulation associated with DAF-16 and SIR-2.1”; and \$100,000 from the USDA to Deborah Thomason for, “Older Adult’s Needs in Times of Disaster”.

IEA faculty have also been very successful with publications. Forty-eight research abstracts, manuscripts, book chapters, books and monographs have been published or are in press, with numerous other submissions. IEA faculty are also distinguished in professional service and in leadership roles as detailed in the Public/Community Service table below.

During the fall 2007 and spring 2008 semesters, several Creative Inquiry team members, undergraduate interns and independent study students worked with IEA faculty in the post-stroke study funded by HSSC, a study funded by CU and GHS being conducted at the GHS Center for Success in Aging involving their home simulation lab, and research for the new Palmetto State Geriatric Education Center. The partnership between IEA, USC and MUSC on the new CoEE SeniorSMART and the new Palmetto State Geriatric Education Center recently funded by HRSA provides the mechanism for offering interdisciplinary, inter-institutional masters and doctoral programs in gerontology as well as educational workshops for CU nurse practitioner students, area nurses and physicians, and medical residents at Greenville Hospital System.
